September 4

Troublemakers: The Story of Land Art

72 min

This program unearths the birth of land art in the late 1960's and early 1970's when a cadre of renegade artists sought to transcend the limitations of painting and sculpture by producing earthworks on a monumental scale in the desolate desert landscape of the American southwest.

Levitated Mass

89 min

This film by Doug Pray tells the story of a 340 ton granite boulder that was moved from a quarry in Riverside to the Los Angeles County Museum of Art and mounted atop the walls of a gigantic slot in the earth.

Painted Land: In Search of the Group of Seven

70 min

Past meets present in a film that is evocative in approach, energized by breathtaking cinematography and an uplifting musical score, and offers a new and articulate voice to the artists who were the Group of Seven.
