October 2

Craft in America: Borders

60 min

This program explores the relationships and influences that Mexican and American craft artists have on each other and our cultures.

October 9

Craft in America: Neighbors

60 min

This program explores the people, history, and traditions of crafts from the U.S. and Mexico, noting how aesthetics cross over and back again in a living and ongoing cultural exchange.

October 16

First Face of America

This program takes you on a risky underwater expedition to recover the bones of a 13,000 year old, slightly built teenager, and explores one of science's

most controversial riddles: the origins of the First Americans.

The Farm Security Administration/Office of War Information photographic archive chronicled the Dust Bowl era through the forced relocation of Japanese-Americans at the outset of WWII. This vast collection of photographs remains hauntingly relevant to our lives today.

Ken Burns' America: Thomas Hart Benton

Thomas Hart Benton was one of America's best-known, least-understood painters. Ken Burns traces the pioneering artist's turbulent career in this bittersweet portrait, highlighting the fierce controversy over his work.
