11TH ANNUAL COMMUNITY GALA

Celebrating the opening of *Ubhle Women: Beadwork and the Art of Independence*



Flint, MI – Stunning beadwork, South African cuisine, and a chance to meet international artists are some of the highlights of the 11th Annual Community Gala, happening on Saturday, January 20 from 6-9 p.m. at the Flint Institute of Arts.

The Community Gala celebrates the opening of *Ubhle Women: Beadwork and the Art of Independence*, the museum's first large-scale exhibition of 2018, and allows attendees a sneak peek before the public opening. A fundraiser in service to FIA programming and exhibitions, the gala features a conversation with Ubhle artists Ntombephi "Induna" Ntobela and Zandile Ntobela, as well as curator Bev Gibson, during which they will discuss the origins of the project, the artwork, and their experiences displaying their pieces throughout the world. Following the talk, attendees may view the exhibition and enjoy a reception with live music, a strolling supper featuring South African cuisine, and a cash bar. Pre-event tickets are \$40 per person for FIA Members and \$60 per person for Non-Members. Tickets will be available at the door the night of event as well, with tickets priced at \$55 per person for FIA Members and \$75 per person for Non-Members. Discounted tickets for students are available when purchased through an educational institution.

Ubhle Women: Beadwork and the Art of Independence opens to the public on Sunday, January 21 and runs through Saturday, March 31. Ntombephi "Induna" Ntobela and Zandile Ntobela will demonstrate their beadwork techniques during a free public demonstration in the FIA galleries on Sunday, January 21 from 1-3 p.m.
