Fashion and Art Co-Exist in New FIA Exhibition

Isabelle de Borchgrave: Fashioning Art From Paper Opens June 15

Flint, MI – Featuring life-size, trompe l'oeil paper costumes, *Isabelle de Borchgrave: Fashioning Art from Paper* brings the incredible, intricate crafting of the Belgian artist (and Countess) to Flint for a summer-long exhibition, culminating in a closing visit from de Borchgrave herself in September.

Opening on Saturday, June 15 at the Flint Institute of Arts, *Fashioning Art from Paper* provides a retrospective view of the artist's paper sculptures over nearly two decades. From replicas of Italian Renaissance gowns to recreations of the fantastical modernist costumes of the Ballet Russes, her work spans 500 years of fashion. Each paper sculpture is inspired by depictions found in early European paintings or fashion collections from around the world. Included in the exhibition is a sculpture based on a 1622 painting of Maria Maddalena of Austria and her son, the future Ferdinand II, by Justus Sustermans, which is part of the FIA's permanent collection. The exhibition will close on Sunday, September 8, 2019.

Programming around *Fashioning Art from Paper* includes a fashion-orientated film series, which is free and open to the public, beginning on Friday, July 5 and a docent-led tour of the exhibition on Saturday, June 29 at 1 PM. Of particular interest to both fashion fans and art lovers alike is the Au Revoir Soiree on Saturday, September 7. Sponsored by Neiman Marcus, this FIA fundraiser begins with a presentation by de Borchgrave in the FIA Theater, followed by a cocktail reception and a book signing with the artist. The evening concludes with a once-in-a-lifetime dinner and Q&A with the artist.
