**FIA Presents Sixth Flint Print Fair**

**Local, National Print Dealers offer works for Budding and Seasoned Collectors**

Flint, MI – The Flint Institute of Arts presents the sixth Flint Print Fair, this Saturday and Sunday, November 19 and November 20, during the museum’s regular business hours. Presented as an extension of the FIA’s Print Club, the Fair includes a variety of print dealers, both local and national, featuring a wide range of prints, drawings, and photographs, from Old Masters to contemporary artists. With prices ranging from hundreds to several thousand dollars, the Print Fair is the ideal chance for beginning collectors to start, and for connoisseurs to add works to, their collections, whether new or established.

The Flint Fair weekend kicks off on Friday, November 18 with a “Director’s Choice” tour exclusively for FIA Print Club members, hosted by John Henry, the museum’s director. At 7p, Henry will select works from each dealer in varied price points that he considers of exceptional interest and worthy of acquisition. These selections will be on view and available for purchase throughout the weekend.

On Saturday, November 19 at 1p, FIA Curator Tracee Glab offers attendees an historical survey of the four major processes of printmaking in the Western world, as she guides them through the current exhibition *Pressed for Time: The History of Printmaking*. Prints selected from the exhibition will highlight the remarkable diversity and ingenuity of the medium and represent the four major methods associated with printmaking: relief; intaglio; planographic and stencil.

The Fair opens Saturday, November 19, 10a–5p. On Sunday, the Fair runs 1p–5p. The Flint Print Fair is free and open to the public on both days.
